what is change?

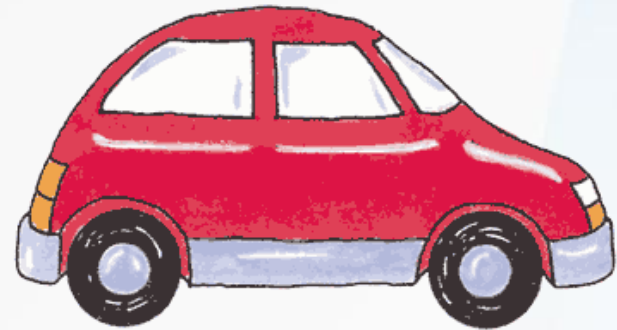
When would you get change?

I buy a packet of crisps for 11p.

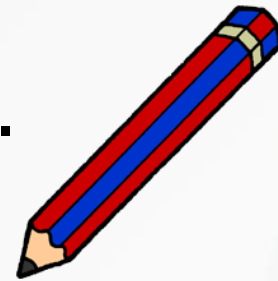


How much change do I get?

I buy a pencil for 20p.

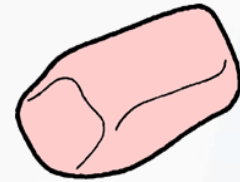


How much change do I get?

Jo buys two items.

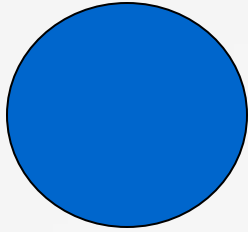
They cost 9p and 5p.

How did you solve this?

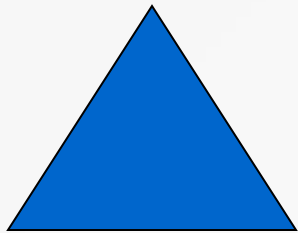
Group Work
